How to play Kim's Game with your child.

- 1. Collect five or more objects with your child.
- 2. Hide them under a tea towel or towel.
- 3. Remove one object without showing your child.
- 4. Reveal the objects that are left and ask your child to guess which object has been taken.

When you get really good at this game you can increase the number of objects.

## Dandelion Ink

The sap of a Dandelion is white but when you write with it, it is invisible, then watch the magic as the ink dries.

Can you write a secret message? Could you draw a picture?

Try it on different coloured paper and see if there is a difference?

\*if the sap starts to dry whilst writing, simply snip a little further up the stem\*



## Naughts and Crosses

Have a go at making a Naughts and Crosses grid with some sticks and stones.

If you are feeling really creative you can paint the stones, one set could be ladybirds and one set bees. You could draw crosses on one set of stones and naughts on the other or even colour one set in your favourite team's colours. It is up to you.

Lay out four big sticks to make your grid (see photo). You can play inside or outside.



## Sock Sorting

Do you have a huge pile of socks that need sorting? I certainly do and any help is always appreciated. Ask your child to help you find matching pairs. Talk about why they make a pair; do they have the same picture on them? Are they the same colour? Are they the same size?

This activity helps your child to.....

- Colour sort
- Find matching pairs
- Identify details within similar-looking socks
- Track his eyes left to right
- Build new vocabulary same, different, match, pair
- Begin to recognize how two objects can come together to make a complete set or pair.
