THEME: Worlds - Lost and Found

The Big Idea:



In this theme the children will explore earth and the surrounding solar system. They will explore how shadows are formed and change throughout a day. The pupils will investigate the history of space travel itself and how countries have worked in the past and are working together now to further exploration.

In Maths, our main focus will be on fractions and decimals where we will learn about tenths and hundredths and recognising these fractions as

decimals ($^{1}/_{10}$ = 0.1). We are also going to be exploring equivalent fractions and ordering decimals to two decimal places. There will also be a continued focus on learning formal methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division and developing quick recall of times tables.

In Literacy, we will be looking at a variety of genres including narrative writing based on the book *Sea of Tranquillity*, a non-fiction piece based on space, diary writing and poetry. At the beginning of term, we will be focusing on our understanding of sentence components which will continue throughout the term. In class, the children will be finding out about different astronauts in history. They will use this to aid their writing throughout the term.

In Science and Technology, we will be focusing on investigating shadows and will then be looking at understanding the places and roles of the Sun, Earth and Moon in our Solar System, day and night and seasons. We will be exploring space travel within Design and Technology.

In our IT and Computing work, we will focus on understanding how we can safely send messages online, exploring and using virtual maps and knowing about sensible profile settings, including passwords.

Global Learning will focus on knowing about important global events, understanding different ways that people work together (such as the collaboration of the International Space Station) and knowing the importance of individual worth. We will also be learning about climate change and how we can have a positive impact.

In Faith and Belief (RE), we will be thinking about the questions: How important is it for Jewish people to do what God asks them to do? and Is Forgiveness always possible? We will be exploring how Kashrut food laws and Passover celebrations show that Jewish people value their relationship with God, as well as learning about how Jesus's life, death and resurrection teaches Christians about forgiveness.

In Art, we will be focusing on colour blending and mixing, specifically looking at light and dark. We will be trying to create awe and wonder through our space themed arts. We will also be exploring the work of Peter Thorpe who is known for creating rocket inspired artwork.

Children will begin their Humanities work by exploring the world from above. They will be learning about latitude, longitude, the Equator and the hemispheres in relation to weather. They will also describe and give reasons for changes in periods of history regarding space exploration.

In Physical Health and Wellbeing, children's learning will be focused on our hopes and dreams and learning how to cope with disappointment.

Primary Languages, Year 4 will focus on knowing the names of some French artists, places in France and some other European countries. They will also work on recognising and using the French alphabet.

In their Music lessons, children will be learning to play the ocarina, studying space themed music and composing their own music.

PE lessons will include gymnastics, swimming and dance.
